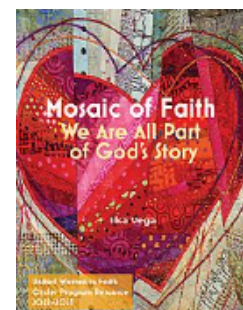
I'm not sure where this year has gone; it has definitely been a busy and exciting one! Our District Annual Celebration at New Covenant UMC was truly a celebration of United Women in Faith. The New Covenant Mass Choir moved the Spirit through us; our speaker, Kim Richmond's, presentation about Creation Care was very enlightening and inspiring; the New Covenant UWF and Rev. Meyer Dahn could not have made us feel any more welcome. We approved our budget, approved our revised District Standing Rules, elected and installed District UWF Officers for 2024. We still need several positions filled; if you're interested, please contact one of our Nominations Committee members. We celebrated 2022 accomplishments: 13 Five Channels of Giving units, 12 Mission Today Gold units and 1 Bronze unit, 2 Justice Today Silver units and 2 Bronze units, 10 Mission Study units, 10 Membership growth units, and 22 Reading Program Participants from 8 units. Each local unit represented gave me hope for our future. Great job AppaLadies in Mission!!

At our WNCC UWF Annual Celebration at Lake Junaluska, September 8-10, we approved our Conference budget, our revised Conference Standing Rules, elected 2024 Conference UWF officers, voted to submit Sherry Sink to continue on the Program Advisory Group (PAG) for the National Office for 4 more years, elected Kim Eller and Renee Hayes as nominees for SEJ Directors in 2024 and Linda Greer as a nominee for Alternate Director. 136 UWF registered for Annual Celebration and 121 attended – 11 of these attendees were 1st timers!! We collected \$3,466 worth of UMCOR kits/monetary donations, \$3,325 for our love offering which is a gift to mission in honor of faithful leadership throughout the conference, district, and local units, and additional legacy fund donations bringing our WNCC UWF legacy donations YTD to \$501,033.78!! We experienced beautiful music, and inspiring speakers, Rev. Holly Cobb McKim of Hudson UMC talked to "The Mosaic of your Life" and "Holding the Bits and Pieces Together" using John 4 as the scripture reference; Rev. Julie Marie Wilson, a UMC missionary serving as Open Arms Community Center program coordinator in Winston Salem, spoke to "Faith in the Margins"; and WNCC UWF President, Joannie Strohm, gave her President's address entitled "We are God's Mosaic, Not His Puzzle." There was outstanding fellowship of our sisterhood. This year's recipient of the Annual Report Dedication was Sandra Williamson.

Our next district event is our Membership & Leadership Development Day on Saturday, October 28, at Wilkesboro UMC. Please see the flyer and additional information on pages 3-5 of this newsletter. We are going to Move 4 Mission, experience some Soul Care (head, heart and soul), learn about our leadership positions, and have some wonderful fellowship. I hope many of you will plan to attend!

From Lenoir, Hudson, Granite Falls: Take Wilkesboro Blvd (NC-18N). Turn left onto NC 18N/NC16N. In 3.8 miles, turn right onto W Main St (NC-18/NC-268) and in .3 miles (at the light) turn right on Woodland Blvd, then right into the church parking lot (just after First National Bank.)

From Boone: Take US-421S to the NC-268 E exit ; Turn left onto NC-268E and in 1.2 miles, turn right on Woodland Blvd, then right into the church parking lot (just after First National Bank.)

From Sparta and North: Take NC Highway 18 S (NC-18). Turn left onto 5th St; turn right onto Cherry St. Turn right onto E Main St (NC-18/NC-268). In .6 miles, turn left onto Woodland Blvd., then right into the church parking lot (just after First National Bank.)

From Statesville and South: Take NC-115N to US 421 N. Take exit 286A for NC-16 (Wilkesboro/Taylorsville /Lenoir); keep left at the fork (follow signs for Wilkesboro) Turn left onto NC-18N/Cherry St. Turn right onto E Main St (NC-18/NC-268). In .6 miles, turn right onto Woodland Blvd., then right into the church parking lot (just after First National Bank.)

From Taylorsville, Hiddenite and Hickory area: Take US-64 to NC Highway 16 N (NC-16) toward Wilkesboro. Turn right onto E Main St (NC-18/NC-268). In .6 miles, turn right onto Woodland Blvd., then right into the church parking lot (just after First National Bank.)

From Elkin, Jonesville and East: Take US-421 N to Exit 286A for NC-16 (Wilkesboro/Taylorsville /Lenoir); keep left at the fork (follow signs for Wilkesboro) Turn left onto NC-18N/Cherry St. Turn right onto E Main St (NC-18/NC-268). In .6 miles, turn right onto Woodland Blvd., then right into the church parking lot (just after First National Bank.)

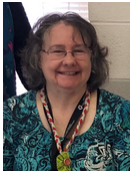

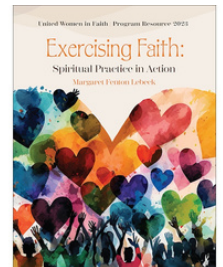

Dear Sisters,

As we join in our common kin-ship as Christ's followers, I greet you in peace and love.

The Appalachian District Annual Celebration was held in Lenoir in Caldwell County on Saturday, October 26th, at New Covenant United Methodist Church (formerly Smith Memorial). The Revised Appalachian District Standing Rules were presented for approval. Each unit received an updated copy.

The following changes were made in compliance with the WNCC UWF Standing Rules that were approved at the 2023 Conference Annual Celebration.

1. Changed United Methodist Women to United Women in Faith.
2. Changed references to LUV to Nurturing Partner Program
3. Article VIII, Section 6, item R add Prayer Guide to items given to new units by the District
4. Article VIII, Section 4B3e, Delete District Secretaries of Program Resources Reimbursement for Mission u. Article VIII, Section 4B4e, Page 22 Delete District Secretaries of Program Resources Reimbursement for Annual Celebration.
5. Article VIII, Section 6P, Delete because Samplers no longer available. (we now have the Bundle and this will be added in at Annual Celebration in Sept. and added to your district standing rules next year)
6. Replacing an officer who resigns her position – The District Nominating Committee will nominate a replacement to the District Executive Committee having determined the nominee's agreement to serving and verifying tenure. After approval by the District Executive Committee, the nominee may be elected at the next District meeting and verified at Dist. Annual Celebration.

If you have any questions or clarification needed please let me know. Go to our Appalachian website www.appumw.com to see and download the newly revised Appalachian District Standing Rules.

Our Conference Parliamentarian is Martha Phillips. We thank her for her help in revising our Standing Rules. The Standing Rules were approved unanimously.

Stop School Pushout!

Join United Women in Faith members and friends in urging Congress to pass The Ending PUSHOUT Act of 2023 (H.R. 2690), a federal bill that would support schools in addressing discriminatory and punitive discipline policies that criminalize and push Black girls and other girls of color out of school.

Our legislators have a unique opportunity to help end school pushout by supporting The Ending Punitive, Unfair, School-based Harm that is Overt and Unresponsive to Trauma (PUSHOUT) Act of 2023.

What can I do today?

Send an email to encourage your federal congressperson to sign on as a co-sponsor of The Ending PUSHOUT Act today! Go to www.UWFaith.org; type "Mass Incarceration" in the search box and hit the Enter Key; scroll down and click "Read More" under "Mass Incarceration"; scroll down to "Action: Stop School Pushout"; click on orange block underneath it "Learn More"; type in your name, address and email in the appropriate boxes. Next, click the red button, "Prepare and Send Email." Add any changes that you would like to make to the text of your email. Then click the red button, "Send Email." That's it! You've emailed your legislator.

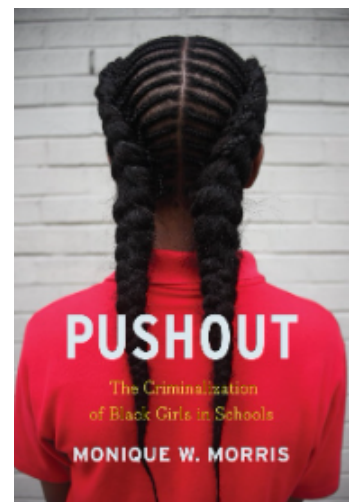

At this time, no more Christmas boxes are needed; however, items to complete the current Christmas boxes are needed. Units may bring any of these items; Infant plastic pants and diaper pins, teen-size gloves or mittens and toboggans, small bouncy balls (without batteries), very small stuffed animals, small dolls, palm-size mirrors, inexpensive screwdrivers, and screws, small picture frames. Remember that these items must fit into regular-size shoe boxes. Your unit may choose to participate in your own UBUNTU Day at any time by doing a community service project.

Also, please remember the 2023 Mission Today criteria. This is on the Western North Carolina United Women in Faith webpage, as well as in the materials handed out at the Appalachian District Annual Celebration. Your unit still has time to complete several items on the list.

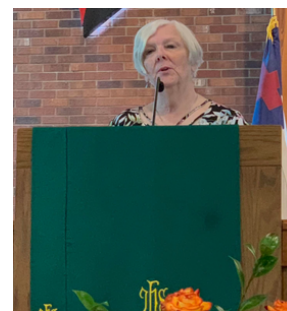
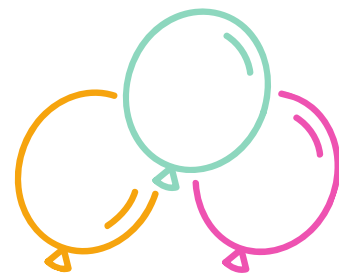
